GOLD MEDAL RECEPTION

During the 2003 Gold Medal Reception held in the Hart Senate Office Building, this year's Horizon Awards were presented to former Washington Redskins Charles Mann, a four-time Pro-Bowl defensive end and Hall of Fame Nominee Art Monk. Mann and Monk were recognized for their charitable work associated with The Good Samaritan Foundation. The Good Samaritan Foundation was co-founded by Mann and Monk and provides supplemental education and college preparation opportunities for young people in the District of Columbia. Both men signed autographs and posed for pictures during the reception.

Together these individuals completed over 62,000 hours of Voluntary Public Service and 31,000 hours in both Personal Development and Physical Fitness.
